I am pleased to announce that Great Bardfield bridge is open and all routes are back to normal. Highways are grateful for your patience whilst this work was carried out.

Government Funding: The Chancellor has announced a number of funding opportunities for Local Government for the forthcoming year. In Essex this means an extra £33million for Social Care, Education is to see significant investment, especially for special needs students. Public Health too, will see an increase. There will be inflation level increases for our proportion of Business rates.

Further details have yet to emerge, and of course in these somewhat unpredictable times, things may change!

Despite these increases the ECC Budget remains significantly challenged and will still be facing funding gaps over the next few years.
